Explaining Symptoms, Types, and Treatment of Brain and Spine Tumors

Dr. Christopher Sarkiss is the only fellowship-trained neurosurgeon specializing in neurosurgical oncology in Kern County. After attending medical school at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, he completed his neurosurgical residency at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City. Dr. Sarkiss continued his training via a surgical neuro-oncology fellowship at Jackson Memorial Hospital and the University of Miami Health System, where he served as a clinical research fellow.

Dr. Sarkiss has expertise in treating all types of tumors through a combination of skull base surgery and stereotactic radiosurgery. He specializes in various surgical techniques that include minimally invasive endoscopic surgery, awake craniotomy, cortical stimulation and brain mapping, laser interstitial thermal therapy (LITT), robotic surgery, and 5-ALA fluorescence-guided tumor surgery. Dr. Sarkiss also treats hydrocephalus, Chiari Malformation, degenerative spine disease, and intracerebral hemorrhage.
